Because the beloved community is what God intends for humanity, the PC(USA) is launching an ongoing campaign to keep you informed about the wealth of antiracism resources available through the church. Books, studies, training sessions and other events will be <u>posted here</u> to equip your church to work against racism.

We plan to add new resources frequently between now and the 223rd General Assembly in June 2018.

The first set of resources for Presbyterians comes from the antiracism policy Facing Racism: A Vision of the Intercultural Community, approved in 2016 by the 222nd General Assembly. The policy contains background information, including historical references and theological frameworks. This month we feature the six study guides that accompany this policy. In a series of hourlong conversations, adults and youth can explore the Bible and racism, study racial reconciliation and learn to respond to racism as a community of faith.

Call to Action: Plan, publicize and hold study sessions on racism using these study guides. Having a facilitated conversation about race and racism will help congregation members become familiar with the issues, and provide everyone with tools for thinking and talking about racism in the U.S.

May God bless the fruits of your work and witness as you begin to share these antiracism resources. Thank you for joining with us in prayer and in action as together we strive to become the people and the community that God calls us to be.

Theological Conversations Free Study Resource



(original story) LOUISVILLE - "Theological Conversations," a series of papers designed to invite congregational leaders in the PC(USA) into discussion wherever they gather as sessions, presbyteries or for adult education in congregations, continues its celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation with the release of "The First 500 Years" by the Rev. Dr. Jerry

Andrews.

Andrews, senior pastor since 2009 of the <u>First Presbyterian Church</u> in San Diego, holds degrees from William Tyndale College (Michigan), Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, Princeton Theological Seminary, the University of Pittsburgh and the University of Chicago, where he earned the Ph.D. in Ancient Mediterranean World. Among his many interests and passions is teaching Patristic literature and the Reformed faith.

In formulating his thesis for "The First 500 Years," Andrews-along with the eleven other authors with varying backgrounds and contexts who will write papers in 2017-was invited to consider the following question in the light of their own Presbyterian commitments and callings: "What Reformation gifts does the PC(USA) have to offer the church and the world for the next 500 years?"

Andrews answered the question in part by writing, "This is the gift of the PC(USA) to the next 500 years-a church that thinks through, teaches, and tests the faith expressed in distinctly Reformed terms, appropriated by conversing with those who first thought through the faith by being the first interpreters of scripture."

Each paper is available as a free download on the "Theological Conversations" webpage and is a study resource with accompanying questions for

conversation or reflection, suitable for use by both individuals and groups. The 2017 series will include one paper written in Spanish and one in Korean.

The series launched with "<u>Theology and Bravery</u>" by the Rev. Laura Mariko Cheifetz, vice president of Church & Public Relations and editor of These Days at the <u>Presbyterian Publishing Corporation</u>.

"Our Reformed faith always moves us forward, loving God with all our mind, as Andrews says at the end of his paper," said the Rev. Michelle J. Bartel, coordinator of Theological Education and Seminary Relations for the Presbyterian Mission Agency, who oversees the "Theological Conversations" series. "Study of and conversation with ancient as well as current thinkers keeps us learning and listening, one of the hallmarks of Reformation theology. We study and learn what we have received so we can pass the faith on to others."

Beacon Hill Fellowship news



In case you weren't able to attend the dedication service at Beacon Hill this past Sunday, there was a great write up in the Ledger earlier this week. Excerpts and a link are below.

"We (the two former churches) had a shared vision on how to serve the community. This is a group of Baptist and Presbyterians that have a common interest in doing justice and sharing compassion with humility," said Rev. Timothy Sizemore, 49, who lives in Lakeland with his wife, Regena, son, Andrew, 21, and daughters Abigail, 19, and Anna, 17.

"This is a new neighborhood for us and an opportunity to serve the community,"

he said. "The value we find is a sense of unity between the Baptist and Presbyterian congregations and a common vision in serving in the name of Christ."

The Beacon Hill liturgy takes place in a renovated sanctuary, said Bill Futch, which so far includes \$50,000 in a new, enlarged sanctuary stage, new carpeting throughout, a new screen and projection system, and new roof. There are plans to upgrade a bathroom to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act and remodel a new, small kitchen installed in the fellowship hall. Overall, he said, up to \$100,000 will have been invested in upgrades once all renovations have been done.

The new service and conviction Beacon Hill is providing has been notable, said

Ray Johnson, executive coordinator for the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of Florida in Lakeland.

He said the merger has aligned "pretty well with what it means to be a cooperative Baptist" and a willingness to participate with other religious denominations.

"I've been celebrating this happened and what's happening in God's church worldwide," he said. "I'm very happy with how they are a cooperation between the two former churches. Both traditions are honored in the service and that speaks well of its pastor and congregation."

Join farmworkers and <u>Tampa Bay Fair Food</u> for the grand Florida finale of the <u>Coalition of Immokalee Workers</u>' Return to Human Rights Tour in Tampa on Wednesday, March 29! We will call on <u>Wendy's</u> and <u>Publix</u> Supermarkets to make a real, verifiable commitment to protecting the fundamental human rights of farmworkers in their supply chains by joining the CIW's Fair Food Program.

The **march begins at 5PM** at Publix GreenWise (2401 W Azeele St.) and concludes at Wendy's (1615 W Kennedy Blvd). Parking will be provided.

CAMPAIGN BACKGROUND:

The 14-day, 12-city Return to Human Rights Tour (March 16-29, 2017) is the longest protest action in the last ten years of the Campaign for Fair Food, joining thousands of consumers in mobilizing for the national Wendy's Boycott. The boycott, launched by farm workers last March, has garnered tremendous support from tens of thousands of students, faith leaders, human rights, activists, and consumers of conscience across the country. In spite of the growing pressure, the final fast food holdout has dug in its heels and defended its decision to shift purchases away from Florida's tomato industry - hailed in the New York Times as the "best working environment in American agriculture" - and towards a Mexican industry, riddled with inhumane working conditions.

This March, the Fair Food Nation will call on Wendy's to return to the fields of Florida and join the Fair Food Program, where "quality" is defined not simply by the guarantee of tasty fruit, but also by the guarantee of respect and dignity for the women and men that harvest the fruit.

Upon the tour's own return to Florida, farm workers will come together with supporters from across Florida in the call for justice from both Wendy's and Publix Supermarkets, with a March and Vigil for Human Rights on March 29! For seven years, Publix has refused to engage farm workers in dialogue or commit to respecting their fundamental human rights. As a Florida-based supermarket and a company allegedly committed to being a responsible member of its community, it is high time they join the Fair Food Program.

THEOLOGY, RACISM, AND CHRISTIAN PRACTICE: How Shall We Respond?

SPONSORS: Saint Mark Presbyterian Church + The Presbyterian Outlook and National Capital Presbytery + Institute of Radical Reconciliation



The series goal is to integrate Christian theology with practices that counter racism in our lives and communities. The speakers have made major contributions to this effort and will lead participants in the critical reflection on steps that are necessary to engage our communities in practices that dismantle the structures of racism. There will be small group conversations as well as major presentations by the speakers. The goal is faith in action.

Dr. Willie Jennings is Associate Professor of Systematic Theology and Africana Studies at Yale University. His book, The Christian Imagination: Theology and the Origins of Race (Yale 2010), won the American Academy of Religion Award of Excellence in the Study of Religion in the Constructive-Reflective category the year after it appeared and in 2015, the Grawemeyer Award in Religion, the largest prize for a theological work in North America.

The Reverend Paul Timothy Roberts Sr. is President of Johnson C. Smith Theological Seminary in Atlanta, GA, a position he has held since the spring of 2010. Johnson C. Smith Theological Seminary is one of the ten theological

schools of the Presbyterian Church (USA), and the only one that is historically African American. From 1997 through 2010, Rev. Roberts was the pastor of Church of the Master (PCUSA), a church founded in 1965 in Atlanta, GA, as an intentionally interracial congregation.

Dr. James H. Cone, known as the founder of black liberation theology, is the Charles A. Briggs Distinguished Professor of Systematic Theology at Union Theological Seminary. Dr. Cone is best known for his ground-breaking works, Black Theology & Black Power (1969) and A Black Theology of Liberation (1970). His latest book, The Cross and the Lynching Tree, received the 2012 Nautilus Silver Award in Religion/Spirituality-Western Traditions.

Chief Cassandra Deck-Brown

is the first African American woman to be appointed the Police Chief of Raleigh, NC. A North Carolina native, Chief Deck-Brown joined the Raleigh Police Department in 1987. She graduated from East Carolina University and received a master's degree in public administration from North Carolina State University. She is known for her dedication to justice and has spoken widely on matters related to law enforcement and the public good.


