PC(USA) launches Abuse Prevention Helpline

Toll-free number to help families and churches prevent child sexual abuse

LOUISVILLE - The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), A Corporation, has teamed with the <u>Insurance Board and Praesidium</u> to help PC(USA) church councils and members of churches prevent child sexual abuse. The partnership has launched a toll-free Abuse Prevention Helpline (866-607-SAFE) to provide assistance to church councils and church families in their efforts to keep predators away from children.



"Statistics show that one out of four girls and one out of six boys will be abused before the age of 18," said former Stated Clerk Gradye Parsons, who worked to make the helpline a reality. "We know that sexual predators seek out trusting environments where children are present and churches are vulnerable because of close relationships and immediate access to children."

Parsons said the Helpline was established to help victims and church leaders get immediate assistance while giving churches guidelines plus resources for training and support to prevent predators from targeting their congregations.

Praesidium, the national leader in abuse prevention, is staffing the Helpline, providing expert advice on how to best respond to suspicious behavior and

suspected abuse, as well as assist church councils in prevention. Callers will also receive guidance on responding to suspicious interactions between employee and/or volunteer and child, and determining when and how to report suspected abuse to authorities.

"Abuse is not a natural disaster. It is not something that happens with no warning signs or knowledge. It is an event that is preventable with the right resources such as policies, screening procedures and training," said Aaron Lundberg, president and CEO of Praesidium. "Through our partnership with the PC(USA) and Insurance Board, we are able to offer these resources so churches can protect their congregations from the devastating effects of abuse."

PC(USA) churches and individual members can call the Helpline to discuss concerns and incidents of abuse, seek criminal background checks and utilize an online Self-Assessment Tool to identify potential gaps in abuse risk management practices within their organization. Those resources can be found at www.InsuranceBoard.org/abuse_prevention.

"We want our churches to continue to be a safe haven for our children. The new Helpline gives church leaders another line of defense to protect our most innocent and vulnerable citizens," said Sara Lisherness, director of the church's Compassion, Peace and Justice ministry. "Abuse in the church not only shatters families' lives, but can destroy the church's ability to provide effective ministry to that family."

Helpline experts can assist churches on how to respond to victims, families and congregations in the midst of an abuse allegation, provide tips on screening employees and volunteers, manage high-risk activities such as bathrooms and social media interactions and develop a safety plan.

"It is extremely important that congregations protect both the integrity of the Church and our witness for the Almighty by ensuring that we are protecting victims and potential victims from abusive behaviors," said the Rev. Dr. J. Herbert Nelson, stated clerk for the PC(USA). "Our effort through the Helpline is a step toward making the Church a safer place to develop and expand human relationships for the Kingdom of God."

Insurance Board President and CEO Timothy Harris believes the Helpline is one of the most important things churches can provide to the people they serve. "Our obligation to protect the most vulnerable among us cannot be overstated."

Rev. Andy Beery and FPC Crystal River in the News

One of our pastors and <u>First Crystal River</u> were recently <u>in the news</u>! I thought it was great coverage of two of our churches (Brooksville also gets a mention) and showcased some good ideas; a good read. Here's the article:



The Rev. Andy Beery, pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Crystal River since September, says the congregation called him to bring new, innovative methods of presenting the timeless message of the gospel to a new generation. "Churches that make the next generation a priority are churches that tend to thrive," he said. "Those that don't are churches that tend to fail."

When the Rev. Andy Beery first finished seminary, he decided he wanted his first church to be one that was struggling. He had spent his previous career as a software engineer, and part of his job was process improvement, analyzing departments in the company that were underperforming and making recommendations on how to fix the problems.

A one-time large congregation in Brooksville called him. They had dwindled down to 33 members, most of them in their 80s. Two years later, they had about 100 people with the median age in their 50s. "We started offering line dancing," Beery said, "and we had more people come to that than anything else." This past September, Beery stepped into the pulpit at First Presbyterian Church in Crystal River as church pastor, bringing with him fresh ideas to reach the next generation for Christ.

"This is the oldest church in Crystal River, and this congregation wants our church to be here for each of the coming generations," he said.

"From a practical point of view, that means we will seek to reinvent, for ourselves, what it means to be the church. Our message will not change but how we deliver that message will continually change to remain relevant to the next generation." Because some people won't go to a traditional church service with a choir and an organ prelude, the church now invites people to come for coffee at 9 a.m. Sunday mornings.

At the "Coffee with Christ" gatherings, families or individuals are welcome to come in casual dress, sit at round tables in the fellowship hall and enjoy a light breakfast and coffee in a kid-friendly environment. The music is upbeat and

Beery delivers his message in a conversational style, walking among the people rather than standing in the pulpit. The church has also started Lifetree Cafe from 6-7 p.m. Wednesdays, a time for people to hear inspiring video or live stories about a variety of current topics and then engage in conversation with friends and strangers.

On Tuesdays from 6-9 p.m., Celebrate Recovery, a biblically based 12-step program, meets at the church. This is open to anyone who struggles with "hurts, hang-ups or habits." With an estimated opening day in May, the church is working on a gourmet coffee boutique in the Winn-Dixie plaza next to the church.

"Think 'Christian Starbucks," Beery said. "It will be staffed by volunteers, and all the proceeds will go to fund our food pantry and other outreach ministries." Beery spent his high school years in Brazil and that's where he got his taste for good coffee.

"It's a sacramental beverage," he joked.


But more than that, coffee is a tool to build relationships.

"Our motto is 'Making the world a better place one sip at a time," he said. "This lets us be in the community without intimidating the community." He said that churches that hold onto their traditions and resist change or expect new people to adapt to their ways are churches that are destined to fail.

"But churches that make the next generation a priority are churches that tend to thrive," he said. "The message doesn't change, but how you deliver it, the method, has to change to remain relevant. Churches that remember that and keep reinventing how they deliver the message to their community are churches that continue to thrive."

He added, "This church has been in this community a long time, and they are ready and willing to do whatever it takes to be here for generations to come."

The Community Food Pantry will be participating in **Give Day Tampa Bay** on May 2nd 2017. **Give Day Tampa Bay** is part of a national event in which communities across the country ask business and individuals to give to their local nonprofits on

one specific day -- May 2, 2017. The theme, *Live Here Give Here*, highlights the fact that all donations given on Give Day will remain right here in the Tampa Bay area. this is the fourth year the Community Foundation of Tampa Bay has sponsored this event, which raised nearly \$2 million for 600 Tampa Bay area nonprofits last year, we are proud to be one of them.

The CFP strives to end the physical and emotional hunger of families in a dignified manner. We serve some of the hard-to-reach areas of Tampa through local agencies and homeless outreach. We also collaborate with the local community garden (Vista Gardens) to compost produce that cannot be served, it's given to the earth and then is returned to the pantry in the form of beautiful fresh veggies for our families, wasting as little as possible at all time.

About a third of people served in our pantry are children, and 10% are seniors. Children at risk of hunger are more likely to be in poor health and struggle in school. Family members in food-insecure households are also more likely to struggle with psychological and behavioral health issues. The CFP takes a comprehensive approach to serving our clients that not only alleviates hunger but also provides support services such as health screenings, veterans' assistance, and nutritional education for the whole person.



Mediation Skills Training Institute for Church Leaders (Oct.2-6, 2017, Lakeland, FL)

Whether in the home, school, community, church or workplace conflict is an inevitable part of life. Having the skills to function effectively in emotionally intense, conflicted situations is important for all of us, especially those of us who are leaders. The Lombard Mennonite Peace Center has trained hundred of church leaders from a wide range of denominations in the skills that are needed to deal with conflict in the church setting through its Mediation Skills Training Institute. The Mediation Skills Training Institute equips people for working in various conflicted situations, including church disputes. Participants learn about:

- Biblical foundations-finding renewal in conflict.
- Individual styles of response to conflict.
- Win-win negotiation skills.
- Skills to mediate conflict between individuals.
- Tools to effectively manage congregational conflict.
- Skills for serving as an outside consultant to conflicted churches.

The institute includes lectures, discussion, and guided practice in role-plays. Active and practical in focus, the sessions emphasize hands-on skills training and real-life role-plays based on the kinds of conflicts faced by participants.


