News From Around the Presbytery



A Word from J Herbert Nelson

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation" (2 Corinthians 4:18, Roman).

"In each time and place there are particular problems and crises through which God calls the church to act" (Book of Confessions, The Confession of 1967, 9.43, Roman).

The words of Paul to the church in Corinth and the Confession of 1967 are words that compelled the 222nd General Assembly (2016) to establish the Freedom Rising initiative (Minutes, 2016, Part I, pp. 570ff). The assembly called upon the church to respond to a crisis of special magnitude: the oppression of racism damaging the lives of African American males. Freedom Rising is a starting point with five pilot cities.



In recent weeks, with the events of Charlottesville, Virginia, we have been reminded, again, that our culture systematically devalues black lives. So, as the church seeks the reconciling ministry to which it is called, I commend this initiative to you for your support. One way to support this initiative is to use the locally retained portion of the **Peace & Global Witness Offering**.

This initiative will pilot in five cities-New York, Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Charlotte, and

Baltimore. The response, working with programs and agencies in each city, will offer support, development, and healing in each city. The action of the General Assembly set a goal of \$5 million to fund the pilot initiatives.

Each pilot city is seeking to address some of the most pressing problems affecting African American males, such as high unemployment, mass incarceration, and substance abuse. For example, Pittsburgh is working on a program of church-based mentoring for young African American boys, while Cleveland is seeking to address structural racism around employment and business opportunities for African American men.

The initiative bears the nickname of a Pittsburgh pastor who started House of Manna Faith Community in one of the city's predominantly African American neighborhoods. Eugene "Freedom" Blackwell died of cancer just two months after the overture's passage. Supporting Freedom Rising kindles the flame of commitment that Blackwell ignited.

The 223nd General Assembly is being held June 16 - 23, 2018 in St. Louis, Mo.

It is a demanding, but wonderful opportunity to serve the Church.

The Presbytery's Nomination and Representation Committee is seeking applications. Ruling Elders, Teaching Elders and Young Adults (17 - 23) are eligible to apply to represent the Presbytery of Tampa Bay. There are certain other eligibility requirements that must be met.

The deadline for applications has been extended to October 16, 2017

The Nomination and Representation Committee needs your help. We have passed the deadline for receiving applications for commissioners to GA 223 and we have not received enough to fill the positions to fully represent the Presbytery of Tampa Bay.

We will be extending the deadline to mid-October at our meeting on Sept. 21st. GA 223 will be held June 16th - 23rd, 2018 in St. Louis, Mo.

What you'll find below:

Candidates must meet several eligibility requirements

Some attachments: the application/instructions pdf & a sample announcement that could be used in your worship guide/bulletin or on your website

1. We'd like your help and would appreciate it if you would do any or all of the following:

- 1. Give consideration to your own participation.
- 2. If there is someone in the Presbytery that you believe would be a good candidate to be a commissioner at GA 223, would you approach that person and ask them to consider it.
- 3. Announce the opportunity to serve at your worship services and other events where your congregation may gather.

2. Info on Eligibility (also in the attached Application pdf)

All:

- 1. The applicant must be willing and able to report back to the Presbytery concerning the actions and experience of the GA. It is expected that all commissioners to the GA will report to the Presbytery through a variety of means during and following the GA.
- 2. The applicant must understand and be willing to accept the rigors of participating fully in the work of the GA. Commissioners are required to read over 1,000 pages of online reports and overtures in advance. Long hours in committee meetings and plenary sessions, and considerable travel between the hotel and committee meeting rooms, plenary site, exhibit/eating areas and worship sites is to be expected.
- 3. All commissioners will serve on the Presbytery's Bills and Overtures Committee after returning and until the next General Assembly.

Teaching Elders:

All teaching elders on the active, honorably retired, validated ministry, and memberat-large rosters of the Presbytery of Tampa Bay are eligible for nomination. Requirements include:

- 1. Enrolled in the Presbytery of Tampa Bay for at least three years prior to GA meeting.
- 2. Attended at least four of the Presbytery stated meetings during the two calendar years prior to the meeting of an election year (currently even numbered years of GA).

3. Not transferring out of the Presbytery at time of GA, nor actively engaged in a search process to depart the Presbytery post-GA.

Ruling Elders:

To be eligible, the session of the congregation from which a ruling elder is nominated ordinarily shall have sent commissioners to at least four of the Presbytery meetings during the two calendar years prior to the meeting of an election year (currently even numbered years of GA).

Additionally:

- 1. Shall be recommended by her/his session.
- 2. Not moving from the Presbytery at time of GA.

Young Adult Advisory Delegate

The nominees shall be active members of one of the churches of our Presbytery between the ages of 17 and 23 on the date the GA convenes. The nominee shall be recommended by the Session of her/his church and invited by the session to submit an application to the Nominating Committee.

Facing Racism - The Doctrine of Discovery



Because the beloved community is what God intends for us, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is engaging in an ongoing campaign to share a wealth of antiracism resources with the greater church. As part of the Facing Racism campaign, books, worship suggestions, studies, training sessions and other resources are **posted here** to assist Mid Councils in their work against racism.

This month, as the Church prepares to celebrate Native American Day on Sept. 22, we offer resources related to the Doctrine of Discovery. For more than five centuries, the doctrine and the laws based upon it have legalized the theft of land, labor and resources from indigenous peoples, and systematically denied their human rights. The 222nd General Assembly (2016) of the PC(USA) called the church to confess its complicity and repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery. The action also called for a review of the history of the doctrine and the writing of a report on the doctrine to be made to the 223rd General Assembly (2018).

Call to action: Plan an educational event with your congregations using resources related to the Doctrine of Discovery, including worship suggestions, videos or other resources that are available here.

Hurricane Irma, a record-setting storm, is now dissipating, but the devastation is just starting to be known.

Members of PDA's National Response Team will arrive in Florida, Georgia and South Carolina this week to provide aid, assess damage, and offer spiritual and emotional care for those impacted by the winds and flooding. While PDA has already been in contact with presbyteries throughout Florida and Puerto Rico, the Church remains mindful of the areas where contact has, so far, been difficult to make. Once the information arrives from the Florida Keys as well as the Caribbean islands nearly wiped from the map, the destruction of this storm will begin to be fully known.



How to Lead Positive Change in the Church - Appreciative Inquiry

Question: How many Presbyterians does it take to change a lightbulb? Answer: CHANGE?!? Who said anything about change?

It's an old joke and actually untrue. The Church has always changed and is still being changed, even as Jesus Christ remains "the same yesterday, today and forever." It is certainly a truism that we face a seemingly unprecedented rate of external change in the world these days.

But how do we lead intentional change in our churches successfully? Is it possible to

lead change that everyone actually likes and that leads, not just to the survival, but to the flourishing of our congregations? YES! By creating a positive environment that appreciates the best of what has been and envisions and plans for what can be. Come learn about the "4-D Cycle - Discovery, Dream, Design and Destiny" of Appreciative Inquiry (AI) and learn about leading positive change in your church, your life and elsewhere.

Whether you were able to attend the brief workshop at the May presbytery meeting, this day-long workshop will give a more comprehensive introduction into how to lead change in congregations through Appreciative Inquiry, including:

- The dynamics of change in organizations and congregations in particular
- How and why Appreciative Inquiry works

- Engaging the whole system in change
